At 0226 hrs 17 Feb 75, while at TPD, Sgt. Fowler advised me that there had been a shooting at 4119 Gandy Blvd and that a guard had been wounded. We proceeded to the above location and upon our arrival, Millsb. Co Ambulance Service was already there and w/m Steven P. Bluffstone dob 12 Oct 54 add: 9033 Elliott Circle, Tampa was lying in a pool of blood approx 12 feet West of the stores entrance. He had been shot by an unk w/m suspect who had been inside of the Pantry Pride Grocery Store, evidently prior to their closing up for the night, 16 Feb 75 and this subj had made the cleanup man n/m Elbert McKinley dob 29 Mar 36 add: 2301 North Willow Ave break out a glass door in the Pharmacy Section of the Grocery Store while he held a gun on subj McKinley, the suspect then took the keys belonging to McKinley, 1969 Ford Station Wagon, color blue, having Fla 3-4884, put them in his pocket. The suspect was wearing white gloves that he evidently got from the rear inside of the grocery store at the meat department and also had a white apron and he was using a white apron to shield his face for identification purposes at the time he was committing the above offense. After subj McKinley broke the glass door to the Pharmacy, the suspect took a large plastic garbage can and placed a plastic garbage bag inside of the can and then began removing numerous jars, bottles and packages of misc drugs from the pharmacy. After he had filled the trash can with the drugs, he attempted to leave via a side door, which is adjacent to the pharmacy door, by removing a seal which is placed on the door, however he observed a burglar alarm contacted above the door and stated "this door is bugged" so he made n/m McKinley back out of the door and then McKinley had to carry the plastic trash can towards the front of the store for the suspect. Upon arriving to the front of the store, subj broke out the left hand panel of the glass swinging doors with a large meat honing steel which he had gained from the meat department. About the time the subj was breaking out the glass on the door, n/m McKinley stated that a w/m Guard came up to the door and told the suspect "to hold it". At this time the suspect told the w/m Guard "everything is cool man, don't worry about it". At this time the suspect was standing at the broken doorway and the suspect backed up and subj McKinley heard several shots being fired and he ducked so as not to get hit from any bullets in the area of the stores office which is approx 25 feet from the point of exit of the suspect at the front door. McKinley then stated that he observed the suspect drive away in his 69 Ford station wagon and that the suspect left all of the drugs in the plastic trashcan inside of the store, just adjacent to the point of exit which was the glass door, left hand side, facing West. NM McKinley advised that the suspect was armed with a chrome or nickel plated pistol, either a 32 cal or possibly a 22 caliber. He stated the description of the subj was a w/m early twenties and possibly was six foot tall and had brn hair. McKinley advised that he was afraid to look at the subject straight
